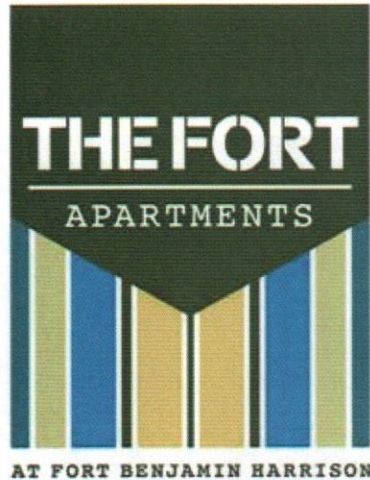

The Fort Apartments at Fort Benjamin Harrison Groundbreaking Scheduled

Indianapolis, Indiana – The groundbreaking ceremony to kick off the construction of an upscale, urban apartment community at Lawrence Village at the Fort will be held on Friday, September 23 at 9:00 a.m. The ceremony will be held at the intersection of Wheeler Road and Otis Avenue at Fort Benjamin Harrison.



J.C. Hart Company, a Carmel-based multi-family residential developer, is developing The Fort Apartments, which will include 224 one, two and three bedroom apartments, some with attached garages, a clubhouse and fitness center located on 6.65 acres at Lawrence Village at the Fort. The apartments will lease for \$800 to \$1,300 per month with the first units available starting in early 2013.

“We’re very excited to see J.C. Hart Company bring their unique product to the Lawrence community,” said Kris Butler. “With the Army Reserve’s expansion and Ivy Tech’s constantly growing enrollment, I believe these apartments will lease quickly.” John Hart, president of the company agrees. “We saw the urban inspired mixed-use Lawrence Village as an integral part of this growing and vibrant community and wanted to be a part of it,” he said.
